- 8.1.1 20/03027/HFUL, 133 Caxton End Bourn CB23 2ST, Single storey timber orangery PC supports
- 8.1.2 20/03024/FUL, Land And Buildings At Fairways, Toft Road Bourn, Change of use from B8 Storage and Distribution Barns into C3 Holiday Let accommodation PC has no recommendation
- 8.1.3 20/02770/HFUL, Meadowcroft Fox Road Bourn, Single storey side and rear extension PC has no recommendation
- 8.1.4 S/3440/18/OL, Bourn Airfield St Neots Road Bourn Cambridge CB23 2TQ, Proposal: Outline planning permission for a new mixed use village comprising residential development of approximately 3500 dwellings mixed uses comprising employment retail hotel leisure residential institutions education community facilities open space including parks ecological areas and woodlands landscaping engineering for foul and sustainable urban drainage systems footpaths cycle ways public transport infrastructure highways including a principal eastern access from the roundabout on St Neots Road and western access with Broadway including first section of strategic public transport route associated infrastructure groundworks and demolition with all matters reserved except for the principal highway junctions from the St Neots Road roundabout and onto Broadway with some matters reserved except for access. This application is subject to an Environmental impact assessment – PC objects. The transport assessment is now out of date due to delays and uncertainties of the busway development. This will have an adverse effect on the proposed modal shift from cars to public transport to mitigate increase in traffic in the local area. In the Report to South Cambridgeshire District Council by Laura Graham on 29 August 2019, paragraph 83 states: "The Transport Strategy for Cambridge and South Cambridgeshire (TSCSC) recognises that the A428/A1303 corridor is subject to congestion and proposes a high quality public transport route to serve the Bourn Airfield and Cambourne West proposals. Policy SS/6 recognises the need for on and offsite infrastructure provision to mitigate the

- impact of the development on the highway network." None of the current amendments submitted address the issue of lack of high quality public transport route.

Tree Charter Branch Membership

Background

The National Association of Local Councils (NALC) has signed up with The Woodland Trust and others to "embed the ten principles of the Charter for Trees, Woods and People (the Tree Charter) within communities across the UK". This is designed to protect trees and woodland.

Recommendation

I propose the PC signs up for Charter Branch membership.

NALC are encouraging parish councils to sign up to the Charter. Signing up as a parish council for Charter Branch membership confers a series of benefits which would support our aim to plant more trees and promote our wider environmental contribution. These include advice and resources and, periodically, the offer of free trees from the Woodland Trust. I have successfully applied for 420 trees from the Woodland Trust which will be planted in the village from November. It is anticipated that NALC's offer, via the Woodland Trust, would enable us to apply for more trees for the spring.
